61. Using superlatives

1 Definition

The **superlative** is the form of an adjective or adverb that expresses the highest or a very high degree of the quality being denoted. For example in the sentence *She is the brightest pupil in the class*, the word *brightest* is a superlative adjective; and in the sentence *Of all the students, she performed best*, the word *best* is a superlative adverb.

2 Formation

2.1 Adjectives

Superlative adjectives are formed using the definite article *le*, *la*, *les* with *plus* or *moins*.

C'est lui le plus fort de la classe

He's the strongest in the class

Note the irregular forms:

standard form superlative

bon - good \Rightarrow le meilleur - (the) best

mauvais - bad \Rightarrow le plus mauvais / le pire - (the) worst

2.2 Adverbs

Superlative adverbs are formed using the definite article *le* with *plus* or *moins*:

C'est Marie qui a couru le plus vite

It was Marie who ran fastest

Note that the *le* is invariable, i.e. you do not write *C'est Marie qui a couru **la** plus vite.

Note also the irregular adverbial forms:

standard form superlative

bien - well \Rightarrow le mieux - (the) best beaucoup - many / a lot \Rightarrow le plus - (the) most peu - little \Rightarrow le moins - (the) least

3 Other points

3.1 Using superlative adjectives with nouns

When applied to adjectives used **before** the noun, the superlative is quite straightforward:

C'est le plus grand fabricant de voitures du monde

It is the largest car producer in the world

When the adjective being used normally comes **after** the noun, the definite article must be used with the superlative adjective as well as the noun:

C'est le pays le plus riche du monde

It's the richest country in the world

The definite article must be used even if the noun is qualified by a possessive:

Sa qualité **la plus impressionnante** résidait dans sa capacité de garder son sang-froid *His / her most impressive quality was his / her ability to stay calm*

Of course, the adjective and its article must agree with the noun:

C'est de loin **la** fille **la plus intelligente** de la classe *She's easily the brightest girl in the class*

3.2 Subjunctive after superlative adjectives

In a relative clause following a superlative adjective, the verb must be in the subjunctive: C'est la situation la plus grave que j'aie jamais connue

It's the most serious situation I've ever seen
